### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



Confession is a big word in the church. It actually has two meanings: 1) admitting one's sins; or 2) making a statement of faith. At the end of the month young people from our congregation will be making that second kind of confession. Those confessions, however, may include the first kind of confession. Both kinds are part of the Christian life.

Colin Powell was the first African-American to be named Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. He was praised for his work in leading our effort to free Kuwait from Iragi domination in the first Persian Gulf War. After retiring, he devoted himself to setting up the America's Promise Foundation to provide help for young people from disadvantaged homes.

He was appointed Secretary of State by President George W Bush in 2001. In the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks, he presented the U.S. case for invading Irag to stop an alleged weapons of mass destruction program supposedly underway there, to the United Nations. After the invasion, it was discovered that the evidence he had used to make our case was inaccurate.

The Bush administration as a whole, and Powell in particular, came under intense criticism. The typical response of government officials in such cases is to make excuses, to blame others, and to accuse their accusers of bad behavior themselves. Powell, however, publicly admitted he'd been mistaken, that he inadvertently participated in a hoax on the American people." He later said it was a "blot" on his record. He went on to say, "It will always be a part of my record. It was painful. It's painful now."

It was big of him to confess. It was important that the truth be known. It is just as important for us to confess our sins in front of each other, and before the Lord as painful as that may be. Let us all tell our truths, no matter how awkward or embarrassing.




